# Strauchrosen (Shrub)



### 'ABRUD'

Height: 2-2.5 m. Habit: Steins grow up to 120-150 cm long, but spread out flatly. Flowers: Double, 6-7 cm across, vivid pink. Scent: Very light. Leaves: Mid-green, medium-sized, glossy. Blooming period: Blooming almost continuouly from mid-May to end of autumn. Tips: Slightly susceptible to powdery-mildew, tolerates dry weather, it is frost resistant. With a support it can be trained as a shrub or climber, it is good for ground cover, bedding. Parentage: 'Bonica' x 'Bolyaiak'.

Height: 2-3 m. Habit: Vety busny. Flowers: Double, 8-10 cm across, vivid purplish-pink, in clusters of 3-5. Scent: Strong and pleasant. Leaves: Mid-green, medium-sized, glossy. Blooming period: Blooming continuously from mid-May to first frosts in autumn. Tips: Shows good disease resistance, tolerates dry weather, it is exceptionally frost resistant. Decorative as an isolated specimen, as a pruned, blooming border, or as a climber along a fence, pergola or wall. Parentage: 'Oueen Elisabeth' x 'Excelsa'. Origin: G. Márk, Hungary, 1988, ® 1995. #### 'MAGYARKANIZSA'

Height: 1.20-1.50 m. Habit: Bushy up ght slighttly spread, rather stiff. Flowers: Double, 7-8 cm across, velvety blood-red. Scent: Lightly fragrant. Leaves: Mid-green, medium-sized, glossy. Blooming period: Blooming almost continuously from mid-May to autumn. **Tips:** Shows good disease resistance, tolerates dry weather, it is frost resistant. Suitable also for blooming borders paths. Parentage: 'Szent Lásló F2'. Origin: G. Márk, Hungary, 1998



#### 'MAMI'

## Height: 1.5-2 m.

Habit: Upright, moderately spreading.

Flowers: Double, 10-11 cm across, Hybrid Tea-like. When blooming its color is creamy-white, then turns to pink and becomes light cerise when ageing. Scent: Moderately strong.

Leaves: Dark green mid-sized, glossy.

**Blooming period:** Blooming from early or mid-May, it is one of the earliest blooming roses. Blooms almost continuously until late autumn.

Tips: Slightly susceptible to powdery-mildew, tolerates dry weather, it is frost resistant. May be planted as an isolated specimen, or is suitable for pruned, flowery hedges.
